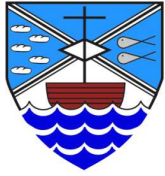

If you have not already made an appointment please make one online via Scopay or ask the office to make one for you. If you need a registration code to make an online booking please contact the office.

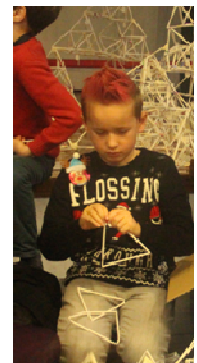
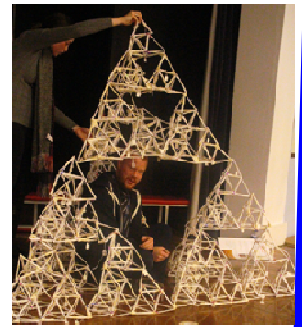
Maths Week and The Festival of Triangles!
