Our School Setting

St Andrew's is set in the most extensive primary school grounds in Surrey, with almost ten acres of greenfield and playground space for our pupils to enjoy for sports, recreation and outdoor learning. The school boasts a number of football pitches and two netball courts, with the added provision of an excellent athletics track. We have a fantastic outdoor learning zone, where pupils have the opportunity to grow plants from seed in our polytunnel and raised beds area, all adjacent to our landscaped pond.

Our lower school classrooms are specifically laid out to allow our younger pupils to thrive and develop early learning skills and attitudes. Their rooms have enclosed outdoor spaces where pupils can explore hands-on, play-based learning.

Our upper school classrooms are equally well-equipped and include two additional learning zones – the school library and kitchen classroom. The school has two large school halls, which enable a multitude of activities to be hosted in excellent surroundings.

We are a Forest School. *Every pupil has access to this, with the aim of supporting and developing confidence and independence whilst also fostering a respectful and resourceful attitude towards our environment.*



The School Journey

The welcome starts before Reception or Year 3: The smoothest of transitions is ensured at St Andrew's as a result of our extensive induction process. We go the extra mile to welcome every child and every family into the St Andrew's community. Our Reception home visits and induction afternoons enable us to get to know every child before term starts. This approach enables all the pupils' needs and interests to be acknowledged before their first day at school. We work very closely with all parents, establishing a rapport that develops through all the school years.

We have strong links with all the local nurseries and feeder schools, visiting as many of them as possible and building on the pupil profiles they provide for us. Parents are invited to contribute to our record-keeping and assessment of their children's progress; each child's growth and development at school and at home is carefully monitored and shared with their parents.

As pupils move through the school years, they continue to be nurtured through the transitions to new year groups. Our pastoral team support individual pupils with any additional needs.

We are proud of this exceptional provision.

Pupils who start at St Andrew's in other year groups are also welcomed warmly. Our 'Moving Up' day supports those joining at Year 3 to become familiar with the school environment. Every new pupil is allocated a 'buddy' to assist with the settling in process. We work hard to ensure this welcome is extended daily; each child becomes secure in the knowledge that they are valued as an individual and encouraged to grow with their unique personalities.



Teaching and Learning

We aim for all our pupils to become powerful learners. To this end, we plan first-hand learning experiences that are relevant and challenging, with aspects of the curriculum linked to enable pupils to practice skills for life and to gain real depth of understanding.

Our Aims:

Teaching and learning are at the core of everything we do at St Andrew's and our aims for all our pupils are broad, ambitious and clear:

- A sustained focus through the school on development and progress in the core subjects of Maths and English.
- The development of outstanding attitudes to learning, skills and knowledge across the whole curriculum.
- Helping pupils develop into responsible, mature students, wholly prepared for their future lives.

English

Reading: An integral part of the school curriculum that impacts on all learning. We want to empower our pupils through the development of a love for reading.

We develop their reading skills using a structured system of reading books for emerging readers, guided reading sessions with the class teacher, the use of high-quality text during English lessons and the availability of a wide range of high quality, genre-classified books for enjoyment.



Phonics: Delivered to all pupils

in Reception class through to Year 2 and beyond if needed. These regular sessions improve and consolidate reading and spelling strategies. We follow the 'Read, Write Inc' scheme, which systematically enables pupils to work at differentiated levels; challenging our learners whilst practising the quick recall of phonics.



Writing: All year groups follow a 'Learning Journey' process for writing that progresses from exploration, vocabulary generation and role play into sentence level and grammar techniques and opportunities for different pieces of writing. Teachers model writing strategies and guided writing sessions are used to target specific needs.



Maths

We believe that Maths matters. We offer a strong Mathematics curriculum using the White Rose Maths scheme of work. We believe that through exploration, play, games, outdoor Maths and access to a wide variety of Maths equipment that the pupils can manipulate and move, they can be supported to become fluent and well-reasoned mathematicians. Through daily Maths lessons and Maths meetings, we provide access to fluency, reasoning and problem-solving opportunities for all our learners in the context of real life.

Cornerstones Curriculum: Our foundation subjects are taught through the Cornerstones Curriculum. This is a rich and diverse project based approach. It is rooted in the principle that every child deserves a fun, engaging and broad learning experience. The curriculum nurtures engagement, curiosity and innovation, brings learning to life in meaningful ways, and really makes an impact.

Computing: Computing is taught in classrooms on laptops as well as through access to class iPads using Purple Mash. This is an online tool that enables pupils to explore and enhance their knowledge in a fun and creative way.

Religious Education: Pupils engage in a variety of activities that are structured to allow opportunity for reflection, exploration of beliefs and values, questioning and enquiry, investigation and personal response. Materials are taught through context as much as content in RE. Themes of the unit are explored with relevance to the pupils' everyday life.

PSHE/ Health and Well-Being:

At St Andrew's, we are proud to teach Jigsaw PSHE. Jigsaw is a mindful and child-centred approach to PSHE and Well-Being. It is an original and comprehensive scheme of learning which integrates personal, social, health and economic education with emphasis on emotional literacy, mental health and SMSC, especially spiritual development. Jigsaw aims to help children know and value who they really are and how they relate to other people in this ever-changing world.

Enrichment Activities


